Reporting to the Manager of Agricultural Services, the Agricultural Services Labourer duties include some of the following: noxious weed and invasive species management; perform weed inspections on all lands within Cypress County; spraying roadsides and private land to eliminate unwanted vegetation; communicate effectively with landowners in addressing weed control concerns; operating tablets for digital spraying records and weed mapping; transporting agricultural rental equipment between clients; releasing and/or monitoring biological weed control species; maintenance of pesticide container collection sites; pest monitoring and surveys; assist with the Agriculture Plastic recycling program.

Our ideal candidate is dependable and reliable; possesses excellent interpersonal and communication skills; has previous experience working outdoors in a variety of weather conditions; and has a safe work attitude.
